Rev. Chaplain Gregory N. Todd, a native of Seattle, Washington, is a 1984 graduate of Concordia College, Portland, receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree in theology and education. A M.Div. graduate of Concordia Seminary, he was ordained a minister in the LCMS in 1988. In 2009, Chaplain Todd received the Doctor of Ministry degree in Christian Leadership from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. Chaplain Todd was commissioned an ensign in the U.S. Navy Reserve in 1986 serving as chaplain for Marine Corps Reserve units as well as a congregational pastor in Illinois. In 1994 Chaplain Todd came on active duty and served as Protestant Chaplain— Naval Amphibious Base Coronado and Chaplain-USS CHANCELLORSVILLE. From July 1998 to October 2002, he was the Chaplain for U.S. Coast Guard Activities, New York. While serving in New York, Chaplain Todd was the first Navy chaplain ministering at "Ground Zero" following the attacks on the World Trade Center. Chaplain Todd was also part of the response teams following the crashes of Egypt Air 990 and American Airlines 586. In 2002, Chaplain Todd deployed to Kuwait in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. In 2004, he deployed to Afghanistan as part of Operation Enduring Freedom. Chaplain Todd then served as the Officer-in-Charge of the Marine Corps Chaplain and RP Expeditionary Skills Training and as the Command Chaplain at the USS KEARSARGE. In 2010, Chaplain Todd assumed duty as the Marine Logistics Group Chaplain leading transition and support ministries for those deploying and redeploying from Afghanistan. In 2013, he reported as Force Chaplain managing the Command Religious Program for over 50,000 Marines, Sailors, and their families. Chaplain Todd became Chaplain of the Coast Guard in 2014. He has received the Legion of Merit Medal and numerous other honors.
