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MULTI-MEDIA WITHIN THE LOCAL PARISH

Introduction

Upon looking at the subject of multi-media, you begin to look at a vastness that can not be covered in a small paper. So it is my intention to limit the subject to one form of multi-media; but before that is done, we must have a common basis or working definition of both media and multi-media. After giving the working definitions being used in this paper, we will look at some of the common complaints put up against the use of multi-media and respond to them. After that, we will give some practical suggestions on how to begin, set up, a multi-media program and the necessary equipment for it.

What Is Media?

Much discussion and information concerning media has been thrown out, in, and upon the people. One of the biggest advocates is Marshall McCuhlen. Unfortunately, he is at many times rather hard to understand. A good working definition has been given by Ron Wilson, which I will use:

"We mean any tools we can put our hands on that will help us get our message through. We don't mean just the so-called commercial "mass media" (although we can use these, too). A snapshot from an Instanatic camera my be a media tool for a group. A cassette recorder, a poster, etc...."

People might wish to disagree with this definition or add more to it; however, for the purpose of this paper, this definition is quite adequate, for media to me is any means (tools) used to get your message across. This is a wide open definition and can be used very well within the context of the Christian Church (which puts limits on this definition, as well it should.)

What Is Multi-Media?

"Multi" comes from the Latin word "multus-a-um", meaning "many". So, puttiing the two words together, you would have: the use of many tools in one situation or setting to get our message across. However, Ron Wilson brings in a different

slant that should be considered. "Multi-media then has become an outlook, a perspective, a way of looking at any communication task, such as teaching, preaching, leading a meeting." Wilson's definition points to the important role that a pastor has in his preaching, worship, counseling and meetings. The media can go from a hand gesture to the inflection of the voice, from the touch of the hand to the look in your eye. Putting the combination of them together, you have multi-media. Even though Wilson is helpful here in understanding multi-media, it is too general for my use in the paper.

A. Scope Of Paper

First, this paper is dealing with multi-media presentations, not just multi-media. This could mean the use of one, two, or three slide projectors and the possible use of 8mm film projector to get across your message. Of course, included in this, is the use of some type of sound equipment.

B. Definition Of Multi-Media In Terms Of A Presentation

It is felt that multi-media in this sense is a presentation by the use of two or three different means to get across a message. Also the presentation is trying to move someone to action or to a feeling. It does not only use the senses and feelings to get the message across. It is trying to get the total person involved in the presentation and the message. This is why it is so important to use slides and sounds that the audience can relate to.

C. Other Examples Of Multi-Media

There are many more media projects then what this paper is going to cover.

However, they should be mentioned, so that we are aware of some of them.

- a. Puppet Shows
- b. Rented or home-made films
- c. Drama presentations
- d. Projectors and pantomime together
- e. Television
- f. Singing and Pantomime

There are various combinations of these that can be used and many more. A little imagination and a lot of work can add so much to the church in this area.

1) Media is filled with many conceptions that are not part of the meaning of "media." When people hear this word, they think of media in the sense of television, movies and, in some respect, radio (all types of mass media) and what these represent to them. Three main conceptions that they see in media are sex, murder (crimes), and mere entertainment.

Response: This complaint contains the heart of the objections to the use of media as I see it. People come up with other problems, but when questioned, they will finally equate multi-media with what is on television and in the movies. Can we really blame them? Not really! This is the only type of media that people are exposed to, and if they are exposed to more then these two, television still occupies most of their exposure time. The centers of media (Hollywood, New York) have taken advantage of these media to present their message, a message that is many times totally un-Christian in principle. No wonder church people feel replusion at the idea of using multi-media in the church! However, we should not discredit media when the problem with it lies in the people behind it. I challenge the congregations—the people—to really look at media and how it can be used with in the local parish on an objective basis; then maybe it will have a chance.

If we take the definition that was given in the first part of the paper, we will be able to look at media objectively. Included in this definition are no terms like: sex, war, crime, or any other perverted term. It only says that we use any tool. The word any may give us some problems, so maybe we, as Christians, should add the phrase "in the light of our Christian faith" to the definition. With this subjective addition, we have eliminated any possible perverted use of any tools in a multi-media presentation. Thus, we have a subjective definition.

We have eliminated the perverted use of the tools in media, but what about the subject matter? Do we talk about things like abortion, crime, war, or any other topic in which sink is the underlying factor? This seems to be an academic question with only one answer: yes. We talk about sin in sermons, so why not in media? There is a difference, though between the use of these topics in television. movies, and a multi-media presentation within the church. In commercial media. these topics have come to be the end, the inclusive meaning of the presentation. They have changed from showing the perversions of our society as sin, to almost glorifying them and using them as examples of a way of life. For example, they use of curse words or swearing is becoming common on these presentations. Since they are becoming so common, they are not presenting them as wrong but only as the common thing to do. In the church, where these topics are used in sense of the malady (evil) that is lurking in our lives and is perverting our Christian : faith, they are not glorified but are seen as the evils of our society and life. But we do not stop there; we have a Gospel--secular media does not have? (This does not give us any right, though to use distasteful language, pictures, and so on in our media only to make our point. We always use Christian taste in choosing language and pictures in order not to create an offense. We must not be afraid. though, to tackle and face reality; but when doing so, we must put it in the proper perspective.)

Maybe an example could be used to help understand this. Take the song "Give A Damp". Should this song be used since it has the word "damn" in it? If we would look at the song, we would see that this word does not mean some type of condemnation; rather, it means to give some concern, care or love. Can it be used? Indeed, it can, if it is used correctly in the script. Any subject that is perverted is used only as the malady of the presentation.

- 2) To proclaim the Gospel or "God's Word," you must proclaim it only through the medium of the spoken word. When Scripture talks of proclaiming or preaching, it must be done by word of mouth or it will be adulterated.
- Response: Indeed, God's Word can and must be proclaimed by word of mouth. However, proclaimation does not only have the spoken word as its means. We proclaim God's Word not only by speaking it but also by showing it. Our lives are the living

action of God's Word, or at least they should be (I Cor. 13). Did Jesus only speak of God's love? No! He showed His audiences and us God's love. He was and is God's Love--loving action personified.

Let us turn to Scripture and see if we find God using more then one sense. When God created man, He gave us five senses. He also gave us the ability to use and to enjoy them. One important reason we have them is to discover and to learn. God used all of man's senses to teach man about himself. He created beauty that we can see, food that we can taste, smells for us to enjoy, and words for us to listen to. God also put a tree in the midst of the garden. Adam and Eve did not just talk about it; they saw it. They were not to eat (to taste) of that tree. Moving on to Noah and the flood, we ask did God only promised Moah something by words? Of course not, He gave him and us today a sign—the rainbow. Other examples of the use of visual aids by God are:

In the Old Testament:

- a. Moses was called to God by a burning bush
- b. Moses used ten visual plagues
- c. The two pillars in the desert
- d. Manna
- e. Bitter and sweet water

In the New Testament

- a. Jesus heals many
- b. Jesus describes himself as a shepherd
- c. Humility equated with little children
- d. Trust in terms of the lilies of the fields

We can go on and on with scriptural references to God's use of visual material to help His people learn and grow. But what does this mean to us? First, when we hear God's Word, we are not to sit back and idly hear the word; we are to envision the picture that is being portrayed to us. When we hear Jesus calling Himself a Good Shepherd, what do we think about? A drunk in an ally? No!! We think of a hillside and a man that is watching over his flock, We picture this scene for surselves. This is what multi-media is trying to do. It is trying to help you and me to picture what God is saying to us through His Word by the use of pictures.

If we can not use slides and songs to present God's message because it is not scriptural, what about the use of telephone, television, cars, and even airplanes to spread God's Good News? Can we even use a Bible printed on a printing press? The answer is rather obvious. Just because these modern tools, available today, were not used then, this in no way makes them unscriptual. These new tools given to this world are God's gifts to us, to use to spread His News. If we fail to use what God has given us, we are not using the talents God has given us. No matter what your opinion is on this question, you can not reject the idea of each one's active participation in the message of God. Even if we hear God's Word only, we are to picture this message for ourselves. Then and only then will it have meaning for us.

3) In using secular music, you are using something that has no place within the church; it has no religious connection with the church. In fact, it has ideas totally against our Christian (Lutheran doctrine) belief. Especially if it is modern, it is sacra-religious.

Response: I agree, secular music on its own has no place within the church. Just to show slides of what the song talks about will not give it a Christian message. However, a secular song can be used, but only if it is set up well and used in the proper way. It is extremely hard, if not impossible, to use a secular song without giving it a commentary of some sort. For example, look at page seven. If the word "me" is seen as referring to Christ through a proper introduction or conclusion, would not this song have a beautiful meaning to a Christian? There are many secular songs that have a good Christian message without their knowing it. Just because they are put on radio and danced to does not mean that there is anything wrong with them. What causes the problems in using a secular song is the words. If I would not have said that this example was a secular song but that it was a religious one and that "me" refers to Jesus, what would

you have thought? What if you heard it first as a secular song and then were told that the "me" was Jesus? What would you think? What I am saying is that many secular songs can be used if they are introduced properly and put into the proper perspective. We also must remember that there are many religious songs out today that can be used, including songs that the youth can relate to in terms of music.

4) The music will surely be too loud!

Response: Again, I must say that this is a possible problem that must be faced. This is why you need to have available a pretty good sound system when you do a multi-media presentation for a large group. For a small group, a good cassette player is all that is needed or a record player. When you get into a larger group that is covering more space, you really need a larger stereo system with large speakers. Ideally, one would have four speakers—two in the front and two in the rear. With two or four, a couple of principles should be kept in mind.

- a) They should be elevated off the ground from six to eight feet in order to get the best distribution of sound and also not to blast those right in front of them.
- b) Practice! Test out the quality and quantity of the sound before hand and check out how loud each song can be. By doing this, one can help eliminate this problem. Many times the churches have sound systems that have the proper height and distribution. If they do, use them but still practice. We should do everything we can to avoid these minor problems so that all can enjoy the presentation. Loudness can be a problem only if we let it get out of hand.

 Multi-media is not used to drive people away but to bring them together. So be careful!
- 5) It appears that it takes an excess amount of time (especially for the pastor) and qualification (talent) to put on such a program.

It does take a lot of time to put together a good presentation. cannot be any denying that. However, as time goes on and your slide supply is increased and you know them better, this time factor will decrease drastically. If we wish to do a good job then we need to be willing to give of our time for In my experience, if the people are really interested in this program, they are willing to put in the time without any complaints. It would take a lot of work for a pastor to do it by himself. This program is not an one-person job but a group project. This type of program can best work with the youth and a couple of adults. The pastor is the theologicial advisor. The work is done by the group, and the pastor is to make sure that the theology is correct and that the content is good. He can give them direction in picking out the slides and help them understand a passage or a song, but he should let the group put it all together. One important role of the pastor is that this mulit-media presentation must have a place to be shown, and he normally finds the situation for it. It is not only being made for the edification of those involved but for the whole congregation. The pastor can play an important role in that, too.

What talent is necessary? Indeed, it does take some talent, but more important, it takes imagination. Everyone has imagination in some talent talents fashion and be involved. You need one that is an organizer, another as a potographer, one that is involved in music, but not everyone has to know and do it all. One person in each area is good enough and through that person others will learn. Even if one is only interested in one particular area, his talent can be developed there, just by doing.

The two most important talents are imagination and desire. If we have these two, the other talents will develop. A multi-media group is there to help people grow-grow in every direction. If we see it as this type of challenge, then we can have fun and not worry that we will not have the best one at first.

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From my experience, that talent grows on people. The first couple of media presentations were hard, but now these young people are taking over and dreaming some great dreams and having good ideas. It will come, but be patient. Practice does help you become better at it.

It is always possible that you can work together with another church. This can have some good possiblities, for this would give you greater access to more people, equipment, money and variety of pictures. This, however, has some drawbacks concerning who owns this or that, where to meet, etc. If you need to combine, then do so, but if you can make it alone, do it and invite other churches to join you. Just make sure there are no problems about ownership or meeting times, etc.

6) Too much money!

Response: Indeed, you are right. A lot of money is involved if you have to buy everything. Let me give the approximate cost of purchasing the bare essentials new.

Three carousel slide projectors:	\$510
One good sound system:	\$400
One movie projector and camera:	\$200
Three screens:	\$210
? of slides	\$???

It would take around \$1,500 to get the necessary equipment, but do not get scared. There are other alternatives.

First, you do not have to have all this equipment to get started. Do it gradually. Acquire the equipment as the money becomes available. If you do a good job and people see your interest, the money will become available and opportunities will arise to earn some money to help pay for this project.

Secondly, enlist! There are people in the congregation who own this type of equipment and they will be willing to let you use it. Make sure that you inform

them that you will need constant use of it for the three weeks before the actual presentation. Make sure you take good care of it. 'If you can find all this equipment, that is great. The group needs to own at least four items: one slide projector, one cheap cassette player/recorder to make a working tape, slides, extra slide trays.

Thirdly, you can make your own screens out of white sheets. These would not be as portable, but they do work better then screens if you can use them. The reason for this is because it takes less space for set up. Also, you do not have the space inbetween screens unless you put one behind the other. The reason is that sheets can be uniform size while screens (unless you have ones of some types) are usually of different heights and widths. They take less space for hauling and storage.

Fourthly, the major costs are only at the beginning. When you have the equipment, the cost drops only to the making of new slides. At that point, you probably can become self-sufficient. Begin small and grow. It will all come that way. Do not scare people away with the cost. In fact, the initial cost could be as low as \$300-\$350. Take five years to get what you need. That will not hurt unless you can not borrow the equipment. (One piece of equipment not yet talked about is the camera, but that will be taken up in the last part of the paper.)

7) There is too much media now. Our young people are being torn down, mentally and spiritually, through media. Besides, there is no use for media, anyway. There is a lot of media now. Is that so bad? What has happened is not that there is too much media but that we have let media be our master. The other problem was brought out in question one. The youth are being torn down by media because of man's sin. Sin is not part of media; man has supplied that.

We get scared of media because of the machines. We feel that the focus is on the machine and not on man. To see a prime example is to look at the factories. Man has been reduced to just turning the machine on and off. Of course, media

is threatening in this sense, but does that have to be the case? Does that have to be the case in a multi-media presentation? No!!

The media, which has been part of this depersonalization of man, actually has the greastest potential to lead to improved interpersonal relationships. Technology should never be the master but the servant. Besides, we are not talking about a super-electronic terminal where you plug in for programmed spiritual growth. We simply want to use better tools to do a better job of bringing people together with God and with other people.

But is that necessary? Can not we just <u>tell</u> people about God? Psychology of learning has something to say to us.

"...the psychology of learning demonstrates that the senses of sight and hearing account for 94% of all learning. Furthermore, an in-depth study by Mobil Oil Company of all income groups of both white and blue collar workers showed that after three days only 10% of the material taught by simple telling could be recalled, 20% of the material was recalled which had been only shown, while 65% of the material taught by both telling and showing was recalled."

This indicates a couple of things. We must use the aids of media to help increase the learning of the church; and, secondly, we can never leave out the personal contact. We cannot let picture and song stand by itself. We must have dialogue, sermon, or discussion to set up and explain a multi-media presentation.

Is this depersonalization true of multi-media? No! It is people that make this presentation. It is these people that push the buttons to make these machines run and move to the next slide. It is these people and the congregation that are pictured in these slides. (This is very important. Use pictures of your church, its people, and surrounding community to make it more real and personal to each one.) It is these people that respond to this message, the message that the group formulates and not the machine, and carry it out. (Usually, a multi-media deals with life goals of a Christian and not faith goals because this is were it can work the best.)

There is also an objective sense to media. Many times people cannot look at a situation clearly because he or she is too involved in it. Media also gives that person a chance to step out and view it more constructively. (This should not be too objective, however for he or she might then draw away from it completely.)

The Christian should have a positive attidue towards media, for through them he can rediscover the creative powers of the senses. By means of the true spirit of the Gospel, this "awakening" makes greater faith and love possible. Through his senses man touches reality, and this reality enables him to relate more meaningfully to the One in whom we live and move and have our being. Highly developed senses are needed to live. fully; Psalm 150 enjoins man to praise the Lord with his whole being and with everything that affects his life. 5

Reactions to multi-media usage in the church have been the opposite of this concern. One youth reacts this way towards his experience with multi-media.

"I always try to express myy love for God, but it is hard for me through words; but multi-media has given me the opportunity to express this love in ways which I could not do by myself." Another reaction to this by another youth has caused a slight problem at home. The problem is that he would rather be working at the church then be doing anything else. Oh, that we all would have that type of problem!

The adults react, too, in different ways. Some give us moral support, some want to get involved, and some supply the monetary needs. One adult reacted very negatively when he was told that the presentation that he saw was going to be taken apart. "Why? I wish that it could always stay together and that the whole church could see it. It was so meaningful!" Not everybody will react this way, but to reach just a few is worth all the time, effort and money.

Another aspect that must be kept in mind is that people of the older age group will possibility react negatively to multi-media because they did not

have it when they were young. The youth are media people; they have had it since their birth and were brought up with it. There is a conflict of interest in this area. Just how prevalent this attitude is at this time, is uncertain, but it should be kept in mind.

8) Media is only a feeling motivator, and it has no other function.

Response: This is a concern that we must deal with in light of the meaning of faith. Media is a feeling motivator but not only that. Look at the definition that I have for a multi-media presentation. Feelings are aroused to get a message across. Feelings are very important to media even as they are very important to faith. Many Christians think that faith deals only with the head and not with the heart; they separate the two. What a grave mistake that is!

Christ did not die only for our head but for our whole body--feelings included.

Media is trying to bring the message of Jesus Christ to the total man in the life setting of that man.

when viewing media, I always see it as writing a sermon. The sermon's main message is justification by faith. The sermon has a goal, either a belief or a life goal. As mentioned before, media works best with life goals. Media presentation can be divided into three main sections; goal, malady, means.

Not every presentation has to include all of these but every one can be used to show at least one facet. The songs are picked to match that goal. There is a message to media in either two directions of faith—objective or subjective. But what is faith? Is it only knowledge? I define faith with four terms.

Faith is knowledge; faith is hope; faith is action (or love); faith is trust. "Faith" without all of these is not faith. All these include not only the head but the heart. Trust is knowing and feeling; knowledge is knowing and believing; hope is knowing and feeling; action is knowledge is knowing and doing. We cannot separate feeling from media; no less can we separate feelings from faith. All four parts are included and every part is needed to make up the total picture. Media is

indeed a feeling motivator but for the purpose of, along with, and included in, the message of Jesus Christ to a particuliar situation.

9) In using many media to present a topic, it is very difficult if not impossible to follow or to get the message.

Response: It takes a person's undivided attention as does any sermon on Sunday morning. Indeed, it can get to be mumble-jumble if one does not pay attention.

Make sure to let the people know that they must follow closely to get the message; do not just spring it on them.

Here are some practical suggestions for the media group to keep in mind that will help avoid this problem.

- a) In the bulletin, give a summary explanation of the presentation. Give the theme and the goal. If it is structured like a sermon, give the basic outline that can be followed; so that they will be looking for something while they are viewing this presentation in their own frame of mind.
- b) Make sure that the dialogue used gives the songs and slides direction and explanation. Do not let it be totally up to the individual's own interpretation or you might lose three fourths of the people.
- c) Make sure that the sound track can be understood by all in the audience.

 Remember, you can understand it because you have heard it many times and have
 the words. They have not heard it before and they do not have the words before
 their eyes.
- d) Make sure that the slides are clear and easily seen. Make sure they represent what the songs are saying or again they will be lost.
- e) Make sure the slides are relative, giving the spectators something they can relate to. Use the people of your church and the surrounding area as the basic basis for your slides. If slides are to be used that have subjects that the people have never seen or heard of, make sure they match the words of the song.
- f) Finally, each slide should stay on the screen from 4-6 seconds. Any shorter time, the slide can lose its impact. The converse is true, also; any longer time

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then that can cause the show to look dragged out and cause it to become boring. Always remember the message and the impact you are trying to get across. You can go to these two extremes, but make sure it is for a purpose other then that we do not have enough slides or the right ones. Go out and get them.

10) Our area and town are too small and remote to supply what we need in subject matter to make enough slides for a presentation.

Response: You and the area around you are the subjects. Also, you can make slides from magazines, newspapers, books, or anything you can get your hands on. Travel thirty miles and get the pictures. Also, there are companies that make and sell slides for this purpose. Here is one:

You have all the resources for pictures, and there is no excuse not to have enough of them. Use your imagination. You can easily stage scenes for pictures. The variety is there in these sources; you just need to use them.

Setting Up A Multi-Media Group

There are a few steps that should be followed that I feel are very important in this process.

a) Read! It is important that you know what you are doing and talking about, especially when you are trying to convice the congregation that this would be a good project to begin. There will be many questions about it, so be prepared. Here are four books that can be read which will give you a good grasp of the subject:

b) Research the cost of equipment, If you can, borrow it.

- c) Approach the pastor with the idea and ask him for support. Explain to him the whole concept and the role that he would play. Remember that the pastor is the main source as to the times that a multi-media presentation can be used, so you need his support. (If he does not support it, you do not have to give up the idea but it will be much more difficult.)
- d) Begin to talk to the youth in the church in order to create interest in the program. Do not promise them anything yet; just create some interest.
- e) Approach the board of elders or the church council for moral and financial support. (The elders cannot give financial support.) Depending upon your congregation, this can be where it stops. Most of the time it will need to go to the congregation.
- f) If you have a youth board, get their approval also.
- g) Get your young people. Set up a group so that you can begin to function. Have everybody read at least the first two books. They should also go to the congregational meeting with you.
- h) Go to the congregation for moral and financial support, unless the youth board is willing to sponsor the activity and has the money to do so.

The size of the group can vary. However, I feel that it should start out small--four or five people--and then grow bigger. Everyone should have a specific job, especially at first. Everybody will fully be involved and has a voice, but a specific individual be responsible for each specific job. You can handle more youth when you have more organization and more for them to do to keep them interested and busy.

Equipment-

I have already stated what equipment is needed, but now I would like to talk about what type is needed.

Amplifier: The amplifier should be around 50 watts. It should be able to handle four speakers. It should have input plugs for a phono, tape deck, and output

plugs for tape out and phono out. It should be of good quality.

Tape deck: There are two basic types that can be used here, either reel-toreel or cassette. Eight-track tapes are of no use for this project. You can
record songs from them, but do not use them to make your sound track. Reel-toreel is the best for sound but not for convenience. You can go in either direction.
You do need on any machine: fast forward, record, pause, reverse limput volume,
controls, sound-on-sound. These are the necessities, but you can get more. No
matter what, get good quality equipment. A sound system can make or break a
presentation. You do not have to have it at first, but (this goes for all
equipment) when you buy, buy quality. You also need two good matching microphones.

Projectors: I would suggest Kodak carousel. The machine should have remote
control with forward and reverse, Also, it needs auto-focus. When borrowing
projectors, you can do without these but when you do buy, get them. The price
for a projector like this is \$160. Later on, you might get a zoom lens so
that you can project from further back for convenience sake.

Screens: If you must buy screens, then make sure they are around 5" by 5'.

Scissors: To trim a corner or edge of a slide when it gets damaged.

Camera: For variety of size in pictures, I like to use two different types of

cameras: 35mm and packet instamatice. For the best quality pictures you should use the 35mm camera most of the time. Normally, a group does not have to buy the cameras because: somebody usually has one or the other. You also need the use of a tripod.

Care And Storage Of Slides


You need to buy the plastic container sheets that hold twenty slides, plus a three-ring notebook to put them in. This protects the slides well and makes

it easy for you to view and find slides. The slides should be numbered consecutively. Where? Since a slide when projecting from the front goes into the trays upside-down and side-way, it is best to number all slides in the upper-left hand corner when facing the back of the projector with the tray in place. If all slides are numbered that way, you will avoid the possiblity of getting one upside-down or side-ways. Also, it makes the putting together of a presentation a lot easier. You should also note the number and description of every slide numerically in a notebook. Example:

501--- I55 bridge across Mississippi with pollution 502--- Cross on altar at St. John's Lutheran Church, Arnold, Mo. 503--- etc.

What should you do with a presentation after you use it? That is up to you, but I would say that if you feel it was good and has a future use, then keep it.

You keep it by putting the number of the slides orderly in a note book. Example:



Properly label it, store the notebook, and put the slides back into their covers numerically, ready for the next presentation.

The Script

Always type out and rum off scripts with the exact wording and phrasing. If you do not, you will be in big trouble. (example on page seven). To mark where you want to switch slides, just make an arrow before the word you want the slide up for.

Nor will you hear a sweet lullaby.

Use a different color for each slide projector. Clearly mark the scripts as to which projector trays they belong to.

How To Start To Work On A Multi-Media Presentation

Before doing one, you should have a purpose. In other words, you should know when, where, and for what occasion it will be shown. Let us use the occasion of Sunday morning, during the sermon. The first thing to do is to select two people who will meet and work with the pastor. In the meeting with the pastor. you will talk about the text and theme of that Sunday, Together, you will work out the Goal, Malady, and Means Write an outline. Do almost the whole sermon. You should discuss how much the media is going to cover, how the introduction anddialogue will be handled (either through the sermon, dialogue, or some other means), how long it will be and in what sequence, how many songs. You then go back to the committee and explain what you have worked out. Next all help to pick out songs to match the theme and to make scripts of them. You should then make a working tape and begin to dream. At this time, begin to pick out slides from what you have and decide what slides you will need to shoot. Always stay in contact with the pastor. Continue until you get it done, keeping in mind many ideas that were presented in the front part of this paper. When you have the presentation done, make sure to practice many times to make it perfect before you present it.

Conclusion

I hope this helps you see how to begin a multi-media group within a local parish and what problems you will face. Hopefully, there are enough practical suggestions given that will help you overcome most of the problems. It will become easier through practice, so do not get discourage. One warning I would wish to leave with you is not to get bogged down with one presentation. Do not over commit yourself with it. Give it and put it away, and begin a new one. Work on the old one as you have time, but do not make too many revisions on it because it really is not worth the time and the effort. If you can revise it

quickly, then do it; but if not, do not. To help one to get started I am including a working sound track on the topic of abortion, with all the necessary paper work. Use it and all you need do is to dream and to get the slides for it. Good Luck!!!!
