So, if you want to "feed your creativity"



Jesus, Why? is a volume on preaching in Lent, at a time when the value of Lent — and even of preaching itself — is being questioned. In the opening essay Dr. Caemmerer reaffirms the value of Biblical preaching, discusses the church year as a framework for preaching, and specifically suggests how the midweek services and the Sundays in Lent may be used for an effective presentation of the Gospel. He shows how discussion, audiovisual presentations, and chancel drama can be used to support the preaching message.

The nine sermons in this book (8 for Lent and 1 for Easter) are only half as long as the usual Sunday morning sermon — long enough, Dr. Caemmerer believes, for those who listen at the end of a working day. There is a strong penitential note in these sermons but the central focus is always on the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Order No. 12U2319, Paper, \$1.95

Richard R. Caemmerer, professor of homiletics at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, is well-known as a preacher, teacher, and writer. Among his previous books are The Church in the World, Feeding and Leading, God's Great Plan for You, Christ Builds His Church, Church and Ministry in Transition (with E. L. Lueker), and Earth with Heaven. He is the editor of Come, Immanuel, sermons for Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany.
