

Part 4 – Psalm 19 A Chattering Creation Leader's Guide (Video 19 minutes)

Warm up questions pre-video: (20 minutes)

- What are our 5 human senses?
 - 1. Sight.
 - 2. Smell.
 - 3. Hearing.
 - 4. Touch.
 - 5. Taste.
- How do our 5 senses allow us to experience God's creation?
 - 1. We can see the majesty of our Lord's magnificent work.
 - 2. We can smell the earthliness around us.
 - 3. We can hear the wonders of nature.
 - 4. We can touch the beauty of our surroundings.
 - 5. We can taste the pallet of flavors our Lord has placed before us.

Read questions 236, 237, and 238 in the Small Catechism

- What is a sacrament?
 - · A sacrament is instituted by God.
 - A sacrament consists of two parts: God's word which he places in a physical element.
 - Through God's sacraments our Lord assures us of his promise of the forgiveness of our sins.
- How through our 5 senses does God reveal himself to us today?
 - In God's word and his sacraments
 - In God's written word we can read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest God's words of promise and forgiveness.
 - In the sacraments of our Lord we see, smell, touch, and taste the physical elements: water, bread, and wine. We hear our Lord's words of forgiving grace.

Read questions 7 and 8 in the Small Catechism.

- What is the law?
 - God's word.
 - Imposes to regulate behavior.
 - Expresses the will of God.
 - Is expressed through positive and negative commandments.
 - Cannot be fulfilled by human effort.
- What is the gospel?
 - The good news.
 - God's gift of salvation for the world, in Jesus Christ.
 - The demands of the law, which cannot be met by human effort, are satisfied by God's grace in the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Read Psalm 19

- What is a metaphor?
 - A figure of speech in which a word or phrase is applied to an object or action to which it is not literally applicable.
 - (His head was spinning with ideas.)
 - A situation in which the unfamiliar is expressed in terms of the familiar. (Her home was a prison.)

Post-video follow up questions: (20 minutes)

- ❖ What are the metaphors that the psalmist uses in verses 1–3 of the psalm?
 - Heavens declare.
 - Sky proclaims.
 - Days speak.
 - Night reveals.
 - God's creation is telling us about God, not just showing us.
 - God's creation is a witness to God's glory and majesty.
- What shift does verse 7 make?
 - The psalm shifts from the witness of God's creation to God's written word.
- ❖ What are the primary metaphors that the psalmist uses in verses 4–6 to refer to the sun?
 - Sun.
 - Bridegroom.
 - Strong man.
 - All these that come out with joy to do what they were meant to do.
- How can God's law be viewed as a blueprint of creation?
 - The sun and the moon do what they were designed to do.
 - When we live our lives according to God's law, knowing that we live in Christ's gospel of grace, we do what we are designed to do.
- How does creation react to God's word?
 - It reacts perfectly as God intended.
 - All of creation comes into being by God's word alone.
 - All creation is God's word.
 - God's word initiates all of creation.
- What does it mean for us as humans to live in God's created world?
 - We are blessed to live in the knowledge of the glory and forgiving grace of our Lord.
 - We are blessed to be able to worship God the Creator, understanding his love for us and all of his creation.
 - Through Christ, the end of the story is made known to us by God's word in the truth of the resurrection.
