Proceed down the aisle closest to you. The assembly may stand both in front of and behind the table, using all three bowls on the table. Please light your candle from any of the other candles in the bowl. Once all the names have been read, the assembly is invited to speak aloud the names of all those they are remembering this day. After the service you are invited to take your candle with you.
