## **Concerning the Divine Service**

The Lord's Supper is celebrated on our campus in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord Jesus, as He says, gives His very body and blood under the bread and wine for us Christians to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sin. In joyful obedience to the clear teaching of our Lord, those are invited to His table who trust His words, repent of all sin, set aside any refusal to forgive, and forgive as He forgives us. Because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and so are unable to receive the Sacrament, are invited to meditate on God's Word in the distribution hymns and pray for the day when divisions will have ceased. Those coming to the altar for a blessing rather than the Holy Supper are asked to cross their arms over their chest.

This service of Holy Communion is hosted by Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church, Freeburg, Illinois, Rev. Bruce Keseman, pastor.

**Deaconess Dr. Jennie Asher**  
**Director of Deaconess Studies**

Deaconess Dr. Jennie Asher is a seasoned educator, deaconess and missionary. Most recently, she has been teaching special education at New Discoveries Montessori Academy in Hutchinson, Minn., where she has served since 2020. Previously, Asher served as a deaconess and missionary for The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), with assignments in Kaiserslautern, Germany (2016–20), and a primarily Muslim country in Eurasia (2014–16). From 2005 to 2014, Asher managed and directed the deaconess program as Assistant Professor of Theology at Concordia University Chicago, River Forest, Ill. She also served as a deaconess at Zion Lutheran Church in Marshall, Mich., (2002–05) and as Deaf Ministry Facilitator in the New England District (1993–97).

Asher has earned Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in Special Education from St. Cloud State University, St. Cloud, Minn. In 1993, she completed a certificate of Advanced Studies and Deaconess Certification from Concordia University, River Forest, Ill. In 2015, she earned a Doctor of Education in Educational Technology, Research and Assessment from Northern Illinois University in Dekalb, Ill.

Deaconess Asher is married to her husband of 15 years, Rev. Joseph Asher and has two stepchildren, Sarah (35) and John (32).
