### Notes Regarding Communion

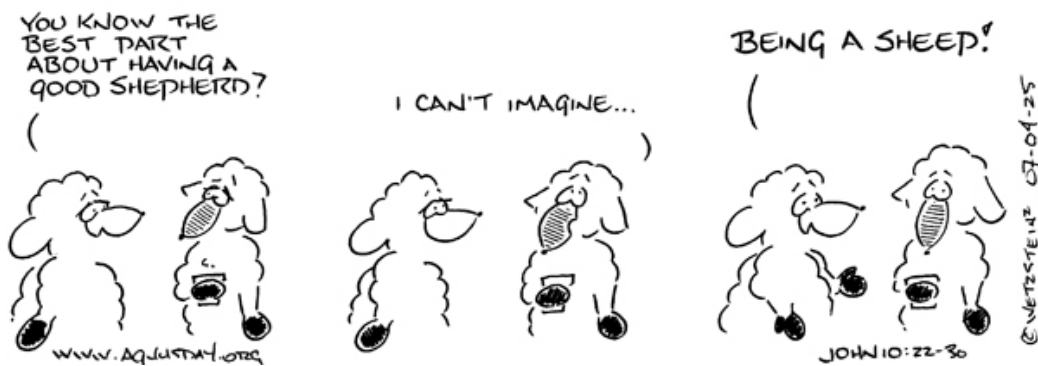
