**and the reproach of your widowhood you will remember no more.** (Isaiah 54:4)

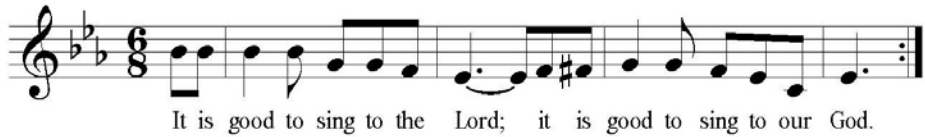
