**Rev. Dr. William Schumacher** is mission professor of Historical Theology and director of the Institute for Mission Studies at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. He became a faculty member in 1996. Before joining the Seminary, Schumacher served as a missionary in Botswana, Africa (1985-95) and theological coordinator for Africa for The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (2010-12). He has taught and lectured internationally in Europe, Africa, Asia and Latin America. He received his Master of Divinity, Master of Sacred Theology and Ph.D. from Concordia Seminary (1985, 1996, 2003). He earned his bachelor's degree *summa cum laude* in German language and literature from Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa (1981). He and his wife, Tamara, have three grown children.

**Rev. Chou Vang** is an LCMS missionary and pastor. He was called to the Hmong Lutheran Mission, Eau Claire, Wis., as pastor/missionary in 2016, and as part-time pastor at St. Matthew Lutheran Church, Eau Claire, Wis., in 2017. The Hmong Lutheran Mission of Eau Claire continues to reach out to the area with Hmong language worship services on Sundays, Bible studies, Hmong Vacation Bible School each summer, visitation to the Hmong community and a radio ministry. Vang received his M.Div. from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis in 2016.
