Pastoral Counseling is the utilization, by a minister, or other Christian. of a one-to-one or small group relationship to help people handle their problems of living more adequately and grow toward fulfilling their potentialities. This is achieved by helping them reduce the inner blocks which prevent them from relating in need-satisfying ways to God and others. The process involves the impact of the minister's Christian personality and life, the Word of God, and the insights of counseling technique so that God may draw the counselee to Himself and lead him to the more abundant life.
