Notes Regarding Communion

-If you would prefer not to drink wine directly from the chalice, you may intinct the bread by dipping it into the chalice.

-When receiving the cup to partake of Christ Jesus' blood, please place your hand on the cup in some way to assist the server in guiding it to your mouth. Depending upon how those distributing the cup are holding it, you can either take hold of the cup at the base on the bottom
