Catalog Course Description

A study of the person and work of Christ, salvation by grace, and the ministry of the means of grace in relation to justification through faith and conversion.

Course goals

Through readings of primary and secondary sources and class discussions, this course will seek to nourish in the students:

- Willingness to speak faithfully as servants of the Word;
- Appreciation of theology as an essential church practice;
- Confidence in the Word of God;
- Faith in God, Christ, and the Spirit.
- a love for the study of theology and its practical relevance for ministry and life.

develop in the students the ability to:

- understand and recognize heretical expressions of Christological doctrines.
- Articulate a biblical account of soteriology as the saving work of God.
- Describe and understand a biblical account of election and preservation of the saints.
- Discriminate, construct, and measure the formulation of theological responses to issues relating to "atonement theories".
- Participate in the rhetoric of theological dialogue.
- Recognize and characterize theologically issues and situations in the world.

develop in the students their knowledge and understanding of:

- Who Jesus Christ is and why he matters through examination of the biblical witness
- The orthodox expressions of the doctrines of Christology.
- The nature and uses of doctrine in the life of the church.

The ordinary procedure will be for students to read the material assigned for each class period, attend the scheduled lecture, and participate in class discussion.
