Course information

Catalog Course Description

This course examines and considers Christian doctrine of and theological reflection upon the Church and the Office of the Holy Ministry, especially with application to contemporary theological issues such as the church's mission and evangelism, ecumenism, church fellowship, the relationship of the baptized and the public ministry, the ordination of women, and the relationship between the church and the world.

Course goals

Through readings of primary and secondary sources and class discussions, this course will seek to nourish in the students:

- Willingness to speak faithfully as servants of the Word.
- Appreciation of theology as an essential church practice.
- Confidence in the Word of God.
- Faith in God, Christ, and the Spirit.
- a love for the study of theology and its practical relevance for ministry and life.

develop in the students the ability to:

- Describe the key components of a Lutheran ecclesiology.
- Articulate the Lutheran understanding of the Office of the Holy Ministry.
- Discriminate, construct, and measure the formulation of theological responses to issues in ecclesiology.
- Participate in the rhetoric of theological dialogue.
- Recognize and characterize theologically issues and situations in the world.

develop in the students their knowledge and understanding of:

- Pressing questions confronting congregations such as communion practice, church discipline, the role of women in the church, and the church's role in the world.
- The fundamental issues confronting the church in the areas of ecclesiology and the Office of the Ministry and the theological basis for responses to those issues.
- The nature and uses of doctrine in the life of the church.

Course procedure

The ordinary procedure will be for students to read the material assigned for each class period, attend the scheduled lecture, and participate in class discussion.
