For Your Devotions

Monday: Read Genesis 2:2–3

- Why (or for what purpose) do you think God rested on the seventh day?
- What might it mean that he “blessed the day and made it holy”?

Tuesday: Read Exodus 16:22–30

- Why do you think that God tells the Israelites, “Remain each of you in his place”?
- How does taking time to rest show dependence upon God’s provision?
- What do you think a “Sabbath to the Lord” means?

Wednesday: Read Exodus 20:8–11 and Deuteronomy 5:12–15

- What are the different reasons given for the Israelites to rest on the Sabbath day?
- What might be the common thread that unites these texts?
- In light of these two texts, what might be the purpose of remembering the Sabbath?

Thursday: Read Exodus 31:17

- What do you think it means that God was “refreshed” or “inspired” by resting on the seventh day of creation?
- When have you experienced a time of considering the works of God’s creation that brought you refreshment?

Friday: Read Proverbs 30:18–19, 25 (see also Psalm 33:6–9)

- What attitude(s) does the author express in these verses?
- Why do you think the author finds these things “too wonderful” for him?
- What do you consider to be the most amazing thing(s) in creation?

Saturday: Read 1 Timothy 4:4–5

- How might we consider/treat creation if “everything created by God is good”?
- How does the word of God and prayer make the things of creation holy?
- How does this text invite us to delight in creation and the goodness of the Creator?
